MANAGEMENT PLAN PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT PLAN
TREE FARM LICENCE (TFL) 38 - MANAGEMENT PLAN NO. 8

The following outlines the planned public involvement activities for TFL 38's Draft Management Plan (MP) No. 8:

1) Advertisement Inviting Public Comment

In an effort to encourage better public participation we intend to use radio based advertising. Radio ads will run for one week prior to the public viewing and on the day of the public viewing, for a total of 8 days. The ads will be approximately 30 seconds long, aired 6 times a day, during prime-time. Two scripts will be prepared; the first will air for four days informing listeners about the management plan process; the second will air for the remaining four days reminding listeners about the management plan, the importance of public involvement and support, and inviting them to attend the public viewing. The scripts will be prepared in late April and early May with the assistance of Mountain FM radio station in Squamish.

Mountain FM's listening audience ranges from Horseshoe Bay to D'Arcy in the Sea to Sky corridor and over to the Sunshine Coast. During late June and early July radio advertising on Mountain FM can be expected to reach in excess of 35 000 listeners per day.

Newspaper advertisements inviting public participation are attached for Regional Manager approval prior to release. Notification of the public comment period will be advertised in two newspapers:

- Vancouver Sun
Friday, June 27, 1997
Friday, July 4, 1997
- Squamish Chief
Tuesday, June 24, 1996
Tuesday, July 1, 1997

Advertisements will run consecutively for two weeks in advance of the public viewing (see attached sample advertisements).

2) Individual Notification Letters

Individualy addressed letters will be sent to a list of key government and community organizations (see attached Public Contacts) and to any previous respondents who requested further information. The letters will be mailed 1-2 weeks prior to public viewing. Advance notice will be sent to the Squamish First Nation.

3) Public Viewing

A public viewing day will be held in the local community of Squamish on July 8, 1997 at the Sea to Sky Hotel from 12:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

The format of the viewing will consist of an informal greeting to view a static display of the proposed plan and supporting resource materials. Company staff will be present to record the number of visitors, guide viewers and answer questions. A copy of Draft Management Plan No. 8 will be made available at the local library, and the Ministry of Forests - District office, in Squamish from July 8, 1997 to September 8, 1997. Copies of the Draft MP No. 8 will be sent to key government agencies, municipal councils and First Nations.

During the viewing period a copy of Draft MP No. 8 for TFL 38 will also be available for review by interested persons, during normal business hours, at Interfor's Squamish office (38116 Loggers Lane).

The public will be invited to respond within a 60 day period following the viewing date. The response period for receipt of public input will end on September 8, 1997. A summary of public comments received and our response will be forwarded to the MOF Regional Manager.

4) Community Presentations

It is our intention to offer to present a briefing on Draft MP No. 8 during July and August, 1997 to:

- Squamish Town Council
- Squamish Lillooet Regional District
- Squamish First Nation

These proposed meetings will provide opportunities for those communities interested in receiving direct consultation. Input from these communities in effective involvement processes for their constituencies will be encouraged.

It is worthwhile to note that the Government and First Nations have indicated the importance of community-based planning. We support this initiative to increase local public input into the TFL planning process and have centred our activities around local communities.
