# CURRENT AND PROJECTED USES OF WOOD SUPPLY

## Current Log Use

Logs harvested from TFL 55 are used either directly or by log trades to supply the sawmill in Malakwa or the plywood plants in Golden. In general the use or trade by species is:

Cedar	Sawlogs are processed into cedar products at the Malakwa sawmill. Shake and shingle logs are sold to other producers.
Spruce	Sawlogs are traded with Downie Street Sawmills Ltd. for cedar sawlogs as per a log exchange agreement.
Hemlock	Sawlogs are generally traded with local sawmills or operators for cedar logs. Hemlock peelers are manufactured for use in making laminated veneer lumber. A minor volume is traded for whitewood peeler to the plywood plant.
Other species	Other residual whitewood volumes are traded for cedar or sold to local sawmills.
Pulplogs	These are sold to Georgia Pacific at their Cache Creek chipping plant and to Asia Pacific pulpmill at Castlegar.

## Manufacturing Facility

The Malakwa sawmill has an annual requirement of 240,000 m<sup>3</sup> of cedar sawlog. TFL 55 provides 50,000 m<sup>3</sup> (includes trades) of this requirement directly. The balance is acquired by log trades and purchases.
