

**REVIEW STRATEGY
MANAGEMENT PLAN 9
TFL 1**



1. Initial Advertising of Management Plan 8

a) Advertisement

An advertisement (copy attached) was published in the August 7, 1996 and August 14, 1996 editions of both the Terrace Standard and the Terrace Times newspapers.

b) Public Viewing

The plan was made available for viewing at Skeena Cellulose Inc.'s Terrace Woodlands Office from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM Monday to Friday from August 19, 1996 to September 20, 1996.

c) Public Comment

No comments, positive or negative were received from the public.

d) Special Initiatives

No special initiatives were conducted through the review period.

2. Public Viewing of the SMOOP

a) Advertisement

An advertisement will be developed which incorporates the following:

- A map of TFL 1,
- An explanation of what a Management Plan is,
- A brief description of the TFL,
- A brief description outlining the Management Plan process,
- A brief description of the SMOOP
- An outline identifying the opportunities for public involvement,
- A list identifying where the SMOOP will be available for public viewing. The list will contain dates and locations.
- The ads will be published in the Terrace Times and the Terrace Standard newspapers
- The ads will be run after SCI receives approval from the Ministry of Forests to release the SMOOP to the public. We estimate the ads to be run in the October 1, 1997 and October 8, 1997 editions of each paper.

b) Public Viewing

The public will be permitted to view the SMOOP at SCI's Terrace Woodlands office during regular office hours Monday through Friday from October 13, 1997 until February 13, 1998.

c) Open Houses

One open house is planned with the Nisga'a Tribal Council in Aiyansh during November. An exact date has yet to be finalized.



d) Special Initiatives

Invitations to participate in the process will be sent to a number of public interest groups and community organizations (see attached list). Copies of the SMOOP will be included with the invitation.

3. Public Viewing of the Draft Management Plan and the Proposals for Employment and Economic Opportunity

a) Advertisement

- An advertisement will be developed which incorporates the following:
 - A map of TFL 1,
 - An explanation of what a Management Plan is,
 - A brief description of the TFL,
 - A brief description outlining the Management Plan process,
 - A brief description of the progress to date
 - An outline identifying the opportunities for public involvement,
 - A list identifying where the draft Management Plan will be available for public viewing. The list will contain dates and locations.
 - The ads will be published in the Terrace Times and the Terrace Standard newspapers
 - The ads will be run after SCI receives approval from the Ministry of Forests to release the draft Management Plan to the public. We estimate the ads to be run in the June and August 1998 editions of each paper.

b) Public Viewing

The public will be permitted to view the draft Management Plan at SCI's Terrace Woodlands office and the Terrace Public Library during regular office hours Monday through Friday from June 1, 1998 until August 31, 1998.

c) Open Houses

One open house is planned with the Nisga'a Tribal Council in Aiyansh during July 1998. An exact date has yet to be finalized.

d) Special Initiatives

Invitations to participate in the process will be sent to a number of public interest groups and community organizations (see attached list). Copies of the draft Management Plan will be sent to those requesting copies. Meetings will be held with those groups requesting them.

4.) Public Involvement Policy

Skeena Cellulose Inc. has developed a process it wishes to utilize to fulfill its public involvement obligation as part of the Management Plan process. SCI's objective is to involve the public throughout the development of the plan. The first step will be to inform and educate the public about the process. This will be accomplished through an aggressive advertising campaign and meetings with local organizations, native communities and local politicians. Throughout the process, SCI will maintain an open



door policy to accommodate these groups as well as the public at large. SCI has divided the management plan process into four stages: SMOOP, development of the draft plan, yield analyses and the completion of the final plan. At the initiation and the conclusion of each stage, SCI will be soliciting public input if it is not already forth coming. SCI plans to meet with groups on a one on one basis as opposed to one big group. This process proved to be very successful during the development of Management Plan 8. Copies of the SMOOP, draft management plan, yield analysis and the final plan will be made available to the public for review. All comments will be documented and responded to by the company and incorporated into the public participation part of the document.

Wednesday starts at ICBC

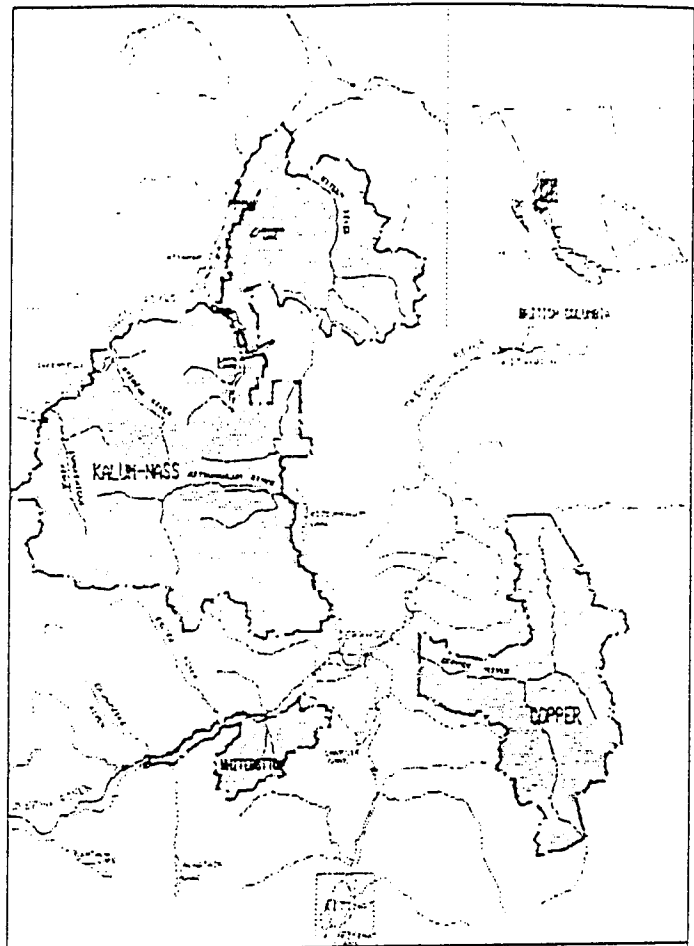
McNicholl said the program will be more convenient for motorists who have legitimate claims while acting as a deterrent to fraud. Experience in other jurisdictions, he said, shows that an RCMP officer and an ICBC claim adjuster working together can complete their investigations between them are less likely to be deceived by fraudulent claimants.

Motorists without own-damage insurance coverage sometimes fabricate hit-and-run stories to get insurance-covered repairs to vehicles they have in fact damaged

themselves. In addition to costing the insurance system money, fraudulent hit-and-run claims are also a violation of the Criminal Code.

McNicholls notes that the availability of the Wednesday morning program should not deter people from reporting hit-and-run incidents to police, particularly if they have evidence or witness reports that might identify the offending driver or vehicle.

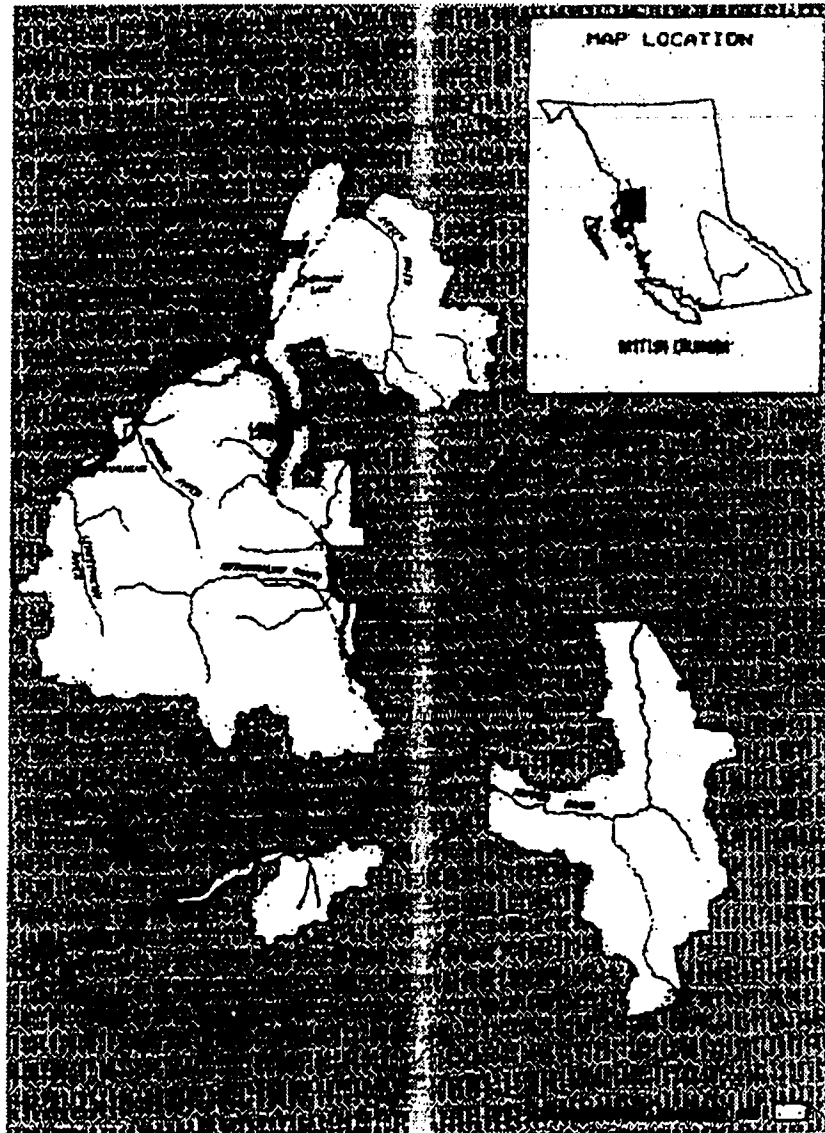
Public Input for Draft SMOOP for TFL 1



Skeena Cellulose Inc. (SCI), Terrace Operations is inviting comments on the Draft Statement of Management Objectives, Options and Procedures (SMOOP) for Management Plan #9, Tree Farm Licence 1 (TFL 1)

SCI is required to submit a new management plan for TFL 1 to the province's Chief Forester before the end of 1998. The purpose of the management plan is to establish the strategic level objectives and management strategies for the management of both the timber and non-timber resources of TFL #1, which encompasses a total landbase of 690,000 hectares in the Skeena, Kitsumkalum and Nass Valleys.

The SMOOP provides an outline of issues and strategies that will be included and expanded in the draft Management Plan. The Draft SMOOP will be available for viewing Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at SCI's Terrace Woodlands Office, located at the address to the right, from October 27, 1997 until February 28, 1998.

RE: Nisga'a Core Lands

Skeena Cellulose Inc. is advising you of some problems being experienced by the company's woodlands staff relating to forest management on the Nisga'a Core lands.

The company recognizes that a tremendous amount of time and effort is being expended by both the government and the Nisga'a trying to finalize a treaty. The Nisga'a have made this their number one priority and are devoting all their time to it. As a result, everything else has become secondary.

Until a final agreement is finalized and ratified by the Nisga'a these lands fall under the jurisdiction of the provincial government and subject to provincial law. Forest companies who manage tenures in this area are mandated by provincial law to carry out forest management activities. A significant part of the management process involves the development of plans and public consultation. Where these plans involve traditional Nisga'a lands, Nisga'a consultation is required for approval. While the negotiations have been ongoing, the company has been unable to consult the Nisga'a properly. The Nisga'a focus is on land claims not day to day work.

Failure to undertake adequate consultation will force the company to submit Management Plans and Forest Development Plans to the Ministry of Forests and request approval. This will place the Ministry of Forests in an awkward position. They will be forced to approve plans without fulfilling their fiduciary responsibility.

The current Management Plan for TFL 1 is scheduled to expire December 31, 1998. A new plan is currently being produced. To date, the company has not had a response from the Nisga'a, let alone any meetings.

We appreciate any assistance you may be able to provide the company on this matter.
