## Incidents Reported for the Week of December 5<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup>

- 1. Surface Mobile Equipment Out of Control:** A pickup truck went over two berms and down a dump face before coming to a stop. The operator had minor cuts and scrapes and was taken to hospital for assessment of potential head trauma.
- 2. Surface Blasting:** A dozer entered a loaded blast pattern.
- 3. Surface Mobile Equipment Rollover:** A fuel truck operator was reversing downhill to refill a diesel tank when the truck lost traction and slid into a berm causing the truck to flip onto the driver's side.
- 4. Surface Mobile Equipment Out of Control:** During operation a haul truck's dynamic braking system failed and the operator used the service brake to come to a stop.
- 5. Surface Mobile Equipment Collision:** The operator of a light duty vehicle lost control when it hit ice and slid into a stopped haul truck. The haul truck was on the side of the road after it had also slid on the ice.

**Comments:** On November 30, 2022, changes to Code requirements for reportable incidents came into force. This revision includes updates to:

- Types of reportable incidents
- Reporting timelines and
- Investigation report requirements and submission timeline.

This revision also introduces a new requirement for proponents to engage with Indigenous Nations on select reportable incidents.
