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## Reportable Incidents 12

## Incidents Reported for the Week of March 13th to 19th, 2023

- 1. Underground Operations Paste fill failure resulted in 100 tons of dry paste being overshot.
- 2. Surface Mobile Equipment A haul truck experienced a loss of the primary braking system while descending a ramp into the mine's pit. The operator was able to bring the equipment to a safe stop utilizing the secondary braking system.
- 3. **Surface Electrical** A H2S monitor triggered a plant evacuation after a back-up generator failed to start during a power outage.
- **4. Surface Geotechnical** End-dump spoil failure resulted in debris flowing down a drainage channel into an existing containment berm.
- **5. Surface Electrical** A worker received an electrical shock while welding on a haul truck.
- **6. Underground Equipment** A cable bolter cassette dislodged and rolled down the mine's decline access ramp.
- 7. Surface Mobile Equipment A truck backed into the bumper of another empty truck.
- 8. Surface Blasting An excavator operator noticed an orange booster fall out of the excavator's bucket to the ground while digging out previously blasted material.
- **9. Surface Mobile Equipment Fire** While performing maintenance on mobile equipment a fire was noticed on the equipment's filter housing. The fire was successfully extinguished.
- **10. Surface Other** A slurry pipe joint came apart resulting in a transfer pump to be left hanging in the air and slurry being released from the pipe onto the mill's basement floor.
- 11. Surface Mobile Equipment Fire The fire suppression system on a piece of mobile equipment did not activate when the operator attempted to use the system. The operator was then able to extinguish the fire with a portable fire extinguisher.
- **12. Underground Hoisting Plant** A hoist came to a sudden stop while being lowered and the operator noticed a slack rope alarm. Upon attempting to lower the cage further the cage stopped again and all work was immediately stopped.

## **Comments:**

A reminder for all mine managers that investigative reports are required to be submitted within 60 days of the incident occurrence pursuant to 1.7.2 (1)(c) of the 2022 HSRC.
