Reportable Incidents

Incidents Reported for the Week of October 16th to 22nd, 2023.

- 1. **Surface Operations:** An employee was standing near a metal magnet of a jaw crusher when the magnet and metal conveyor turned on, trapping the employee.
- 2. **Surface Misfire:** A dozer moving material found a primer and booster.
- **3. Surface Blasting:** A blaster was working with two trucks loading blast holes. The blaster placed a primer assembly next to a hole for one truck, but it did not get loaded and was left on the ground.
- **4. Surface Operations:** A worker complained of lower back discomfort. A few hours later, they stepped off a drill pad and immediately felt pain, muscle spasms, and could not walk. The worker was transported to medical care.
- 5. Surface Operations: Two field mechanics attempted to remove the upper hoist cylinder pin on a haul truck. A chain was attached to a telehandler forklift, and when tension was applied, the chain failed and damaged the forklift's windshield.
- 6. **Surface Operations:** A worker was replacing the front left steer tire of a grader when the tire lost air pressure. The lock ring and bead band released and struck the employee, resulting in facial lacerations.
- 7. **Surface Operations:** Workers were moving a pre-tied rebar wall mat using a crane. During the transfer, the load shifted, and a worker was caught between the rebar mat and form dowels. The worker was transferred to the hospital, where no injuries were found, and the worker was cleared for regular duties.
- **8. Surface Mobile Equipment Out of Control:** A scraper on a crush pile became angled causing it to tip over. Mine rescue was dispatched; the worker safely exited the machine.
- 9. Surface Misfire: A dozer operator came within 8 metres of a known, unmarked misfire.
- **10. Surface Misfire:** A primed booster was uncovered by a machine digging in a pattern.
- **11. Surface Mobile Equipment Fire:** A haul truck operator noticed smoke coming out the exhaust. The truck was shut down; a fire was found in the engine compartment, which the operator extinguished.
- 12. Surface Mobile Equipment Collision: A haul truck backed into the front railing of another haul truck.

Comments: A blaster shall identify any misfired holes in accordance with the Code s8.6.5 and misfire locations shall be recorded by a shiftboss in the daily examination and report book, as per the Code s8.6.6.
