ORDER OF THE CHIEF GOLD COMMISSIONER

WHEREAS, MAKIE GUO, the recorded holder of placer claim title number 1043079 registered physical exploration and development work pursuant to Section 29 of the *Mineral Tenure Act* (the Act);

AND WHEREAS, Section 33(1) of the Act requires the recorded holder to submit a report in the form and manner prescribed by the regulations respecting this physical exploration and development;

AND WHEREAS notice was given to the recorded holder of the intention to cancel the registration of the recording of exploration and development if a report in the form and manner prescribed by the regulations was not submitted;

AND WHEREAS the recorded holder has not submitted a report in the form and manner as prescribed by the regulations;

I, Mark Messmer, Chief Gold Commissioner for the Province of British Columbia, order the cancellation of the work credits recorded on event 5641168 based on the following:

- Section 15(2) of the Mineral Tenure Act Regulation (the Regulation) states that a physical report must be submitted within 30 days from the date of registration of work in a format acceptable to the Chief Gold Commissioner.
- Section 15(3) of the Regulation states that if the recorded holder fails to submit a report as required, the Chief Gold Commissioner may notify the recorded holder of the intention to cancel the registration of the recording of exploration and development under Section 33 of the Act.

- On March 9, 2017, exploration and development work was registered and recorded as per Mineral Titles Online (MTO) event number 5641168.
- On June 1, 2017, you were advised by letter and email that the physical work report received did not meet the prescribed requirements in section 15 of the Regulation.
- On October 2, 2017, you were notified by registered letter and email of the Chief Gold Commissioner's intention to cancel the registration of the recording of the exploration and development work, should the amended report not be submitted within 14 days of the date of the letter.
- To date, the amended report has not been received.
