The undersigned has the honour to recommend that pursuant to subsection (5) of section 14 of the Mineral Act, Chapter 213 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia 1948, a reservation be placed upon all minerals in the following lands, namely:

All and singular those lands and premises in the New Westminster Mining Division lying along the valley of Jones Lake (also known as Wahleach Lake) and Creek and along the valleys of tributaries to the said lake and creek bounded by and below the 2150-foot contour of elevation southerly from the point where the said contours of elevation cross the north boundaries of the southeast and southwest quarters of Section 32, Township 3, Range 27.

And also Sections 23 and 24 and the north halves of Sections 13, 14 and 15, Township 3, Range 28 and Section 19 and the north half of Section 18, Township 3, Range 27.

And that the undersigned Minister of Mines sign an Order to that effect and that the said Order be published in one issue of the Gazette.
