(5) of section 14 of the "Mineral Act", chapter 213 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia 1946, a reservation be placed upon all minerals in the following described lands in the Omineca and Skeena Mining Divisions, namely:-

All and singular those lands and premises of all that area in the Nechako River, Buchu Lake, Tetachuck River, Tetachuck Lake, Eutsuk Lake, Nechaluk Lake, Ootsa River, Ootsa Lake, Staciak Lake, Intata River, Whitesall Lake, Tahsa River, Tahsa Lake, Whitesall Lake, Cheslatta Lake, Cheslatta River and Skins Lake drainage basins, including all connecting and tributary streams and lakes lying upstream from a line drawn north and south across the Nechako River at the east end of a small lake (longitude 124 degrees and 50 minutes) and below an elevation of 3,000 feet (assuming mean highwater of Eutsuk Lake to be at an elevation of 2017 feet) excepting thereout that part of the valley of the stream draining Inapp Lake beyond one mile from Cheslatta Lake;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands: namely, an area six miles wide, being three miles on either side of a straight line drawn southwesterly from the southerly extremity of Pondoy Lake to the junction of Trapper Creek with the Kimsquit River (Trapper Creek enters the Kimsquit from the southeast twelve miles north of and one and a half miles west of the mouth of Kimsquit River); (b) one four and a half miles wide, being three and a half miles to the west and one mile to the east of a straight line drawn from the said junction south approximately ten miles to its intersection of the Kimsquit River; thence six miles wide, being three miles on either side of a straight line drawn southeast from the said intersection for eleven miles;

And upon all minerals in the following lands: namely, an area three and a half miles wide lying to the east of a straight line drawn south from the east end of Suroi Lake to the Kinsquut River;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands: namely, all that area in the Nanika River, Kidprice Lake, and Nanika Lake drainage basins, including all connecting and tributary streams and lakes lying upstream from a line drawn east and west across the Nanika River four miles below the outlet of Kidprice Lake and below an elevation of 3200 feet;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands: namely, an area eight miles wide of a straight line and Tahesa Lake) lying to the northeast (immediately to the west of the west end of a small lake (immediately to the west end of Tahesa Lake) to the west end of Nanika Lake) to the west end of Tahesa Lake;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands: namely, an area four miles wide being two miles on either side of a straight line drawn from the head of Tahesa Lake to the junction of Horotaky Creek with the Kemano River; thence three miles wide being one and a half miles on either side of the centre line of the Kemano River to its mouth; thence three miles wide being one and a half miles on either side of a straight line drawn from the said mouth of the Kemano River west for two miles;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands: namely, an area one mile wide along the northerly and eastern shores of Barry Reach, Europa Reach; Alan Reach; the head Devastation Channel, Douglas Channel and Kitimat Arm to the head of said Kitimat Arm, including one mile southeasterly from Cornwall point between Barry Reach and Europa Reach;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands: namely, an area one mile wide lying westerly from the centre line of the Kemano River from the junction of Horotaky Creek upstream for nine miles; thence an area two miles wide, being one mile on either side of a line drawn from the said point to a fork on Kildala River, approximately twelve miles from its mouth; thence two miles wide, being one mile to the south and one mile to the north of the wide being one mile north River for five miles; thence one mile wide being one mile north from the centre line of Kildala River and north shore of Kildala Arm; thence two miles wide, being one-half mile to the northeast and one and a half miles to the southwest of a line drawn from the mouth of the Pale River to the mouth of the Kitimat River;
