minerals in the lands described in Order-in-Council 147, approved on the 21st day of January, 1949, be cancelled; recommend that the reservation upon all lands described in Order-in-Council 147;

(1) of section 16 of the "Placer-Mining Act", chapter 214 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia 1948, a reservation be placed upon all minerals in the following described lands in the Omineca and Skeena Mining Divisions, namely:-

All and singular those lands and premises of all that area in the Nechako River, Eutsuk Lake, Natsikuz Lake, Kutata River, Totachuck Lake, Eutsuk Lake, Sinclair Lake, Whitesall Lake, Ootsa River, Ootsa Lake, Sincclair Lake, Whitesall Lake, Whitesall Lake, Tahsa River, Tahsa Lake, Murray River, Cheslatta Lake, Cheslatta River and Skins Lake drainage lake, including all connecting and tributary streams and basins lying upstream from a line drawn north and south across lakes lying upstream at the east end of a small lake (longitude the Nechako River at the east end and below an elevation of 3,000 feet (assuming mean highwater of Eutsuk Lake to be at an elevation of 2817 feet) excepting thereout that part of the valley of the stream draining Knapp Lake beyond one mile from Cheslatta Lake;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands: namely; an area six miles wide, being three miles on either side of a straight line drawn southerly from the southerly extremity of pondosy lake to the junction of Trapper Creek with the Kinsquilt River (Trapper Creek enters the Kinsquilt from the southeast twelve miles north of and one and a half miles west of the mouth of Kinsquilt River); thence four and a half miles wide, being three and a half miles to the west and one mile to the east of a straight line drawn from the said junction south approximately six miles wide, being intersection of the Kinsquilt River; thence six miles southeast three miles on either side of a straight line drawn southeast from the said intersection for eleven miles;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands; namely, an area three and a half miles wide lying to the east of a straight line drawn south from the east end of Sural Lake to the Kinsquilt River;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands; namely, all that area in the Nanika River, Kidprice Lake, and Nanika Lake drainage basins, including all connective and tributary streams and lakes lying upstream from a line drawn east and west across the Nanika River four miles below the outlet of Kidprice Lake and below an elevation of 3200 feet;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands; namely, an area eight miles wide (between Nanika Lake and Tahtsa Lake) lying to the northeast of a straight line drawn from the west end of a small lake (immediately to the west of the west end of Nanika Lake) to the west end of Tahtsa Lake;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands; namely, an area four miles wide being two miles on either side of a straight line drawn from the head of Tahtsa Lake to the junction of Horotzky Creek with the Kemano River; thence three miles wide being one and a half miles on either side of the centre line of the Kemano River to its mouth; thence three miles wide being one and a half miles on either side of a straight line drawn from the said mouth of the Kemano River west for two miles;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands; namely, an area one mile wide along the northerly and eastern shores of Barry Reach, Europa Reach, Alan Reach, Devastation Channel, Douglas Channel and Kitimat Arm to the head of said Kitimat Arm, including one mile southeasterly from Cornwall Point between Barry Reach and Europa Reach;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands; namely, an area one mile wide lying westerly from the centre line of the Kemano River from the junction of Horotzky Creek upstream for nine miles; thence an area two miles wide, being one mile on either side of a line drawn from the said point to a fork on Kildala River, approximately twelve miles from its mouth; thence two miles wide, being one mile to the south and one mile to the north of the centre line of the Kildala River for five miles; thence one mile wide being one mile north from the centre line of Kildala River and north shore of Kildala Arm; thence two miles wide, being one-half mile to the northeast and one and a half miles to the southwest of a line drawn from the mouth of the Dale River to the mouth of the Kitimat River;

And that the undersigned Minister of Mines do sign an order to that effect.
