The Lieutenant-Governor in Council:

*amended O.C. 1377/55
Res. No 329/60*

The undersigned has the honour to recommend that pursuant to section 14 (5) of the "Mineral Act", chapter 213, R.S.B.C. 1948, a reservation be placed upon all minerals in the following described lands in the Skeena Mining Division, namely:

an area one mile wide, being one-half mile on each side of a line from the portal of the Granduc Mine through the north end of Summit Lake, a distance of eleven miles; and

an area one mile wide, being one-half mile on each side of a line from the portal of the Granduc Mine to a point 800 feet northeast of the International Boundary Monument on Mount Bayard, a distance of approximately ten miles, thence southeasterly parallel to the International Boundary for four miles, the area on the southwest side of this portion of the line being the distance between the International Boundary and the said line; and

an area one mile wide, being one-half mile on each side of a line drawn northwest from the portal of the Granduc Mine for a distance of one mile and a half, thence west for eight-tenths of a mile, thence southwest for one mile;

all as shown on the attached plan.
