

The Lieutenant-Governor in Council:

o/c 25/84/56. Res. No. 2178/59

The undersigned has the honour to recommend that pursuant to Sub-section 5 of Section 14 of the "Mineral Act", Chapter 213 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia 1948, a reservation be placed upon all minerals in the following described lands in the Revelstoke Mining Division, namely:

All the Crown lands situated in that part of the Kootenay Land District more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at a point on the left bank of the Columbia River 10 chains southerly from the intersection of said left bank with the left bank of Goldstream River; thence due east to the 2200 foot contour bounding the Columbia River to the east; thence in a general northerly, easterly, and southerly direction along the 2200 foot contour bounding the Columbia River on the east, the Goldstream River on the south and an unnamed creek (which crosses S.T.L.'s 701OP, 7190P and S.T.L. 721P) and Old Goldstream Creek on the west to the easterly boundary of Lot 80A; thence south 65 degrees west to the aforesaid left bank of the Columbia River; thence in a general southerly direction along said left bank of the Columbia River to a point 32 chains southerly from the intersection of said left bank of the Columbia River with the left bank of aforesaid Old Goldstream Creek; thence due east to the 2200 foot contour bounding said Columbia River on the east; thence in a general northerly, northeasterly and easterly direction along the 2200 foot contour bounding the Columbia River on the east, Old Goldstream Creek and an unnamed creek (which crosses S.T.L.'s 701OP, 7190P and S.T.L. 721P) on the east; and Goldstream River on the south to the easterly boundary of S.T.L. 1504P; thence northerly along said easterly boundary of S.T.L. 1504P to the 2200 foot contour bounding said Goldstream River on the north; thence in a general westerly direction along said 2200 foot contour bounding Goldstream River on the north to the easterly boundary of Lot 68; thence due west to the aforesaid left bank of the Columbia River; thence in a general southerly direction along said left bank of the Columbia River to a point 10 chains southerly from the left bank of the Goldstream River, being the point of commencement.
