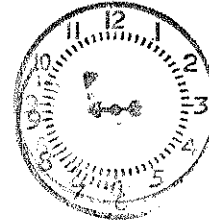

Schedule P

Loss Creek Designated Area

Victoria Mining Division - Renfrew Land District

Commencing at the southwest corner of L. 189; thence northerly and easterly on the westerly and northerly boundaries of said L. 189 to the westerly boundary of the watershed of Sombrío River; thence generally northerly and easterly on the said westerly and the northerly watershed boundaries of Sombrío River to the northerly boundary of the watershed of Loss Creek; thence generally easterly, southerly and westerly on the said northerly and the easterly and southerly watershed boundaries of Loss Creek to the highwater mark of Juan de Fuca Strait; thence generally northwesterly on the said highwater mark of Juan de Fuca Strait to the southwest corner of L. 189, being the point of commencement.
