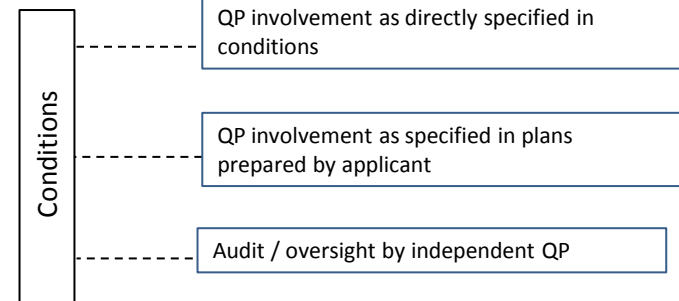
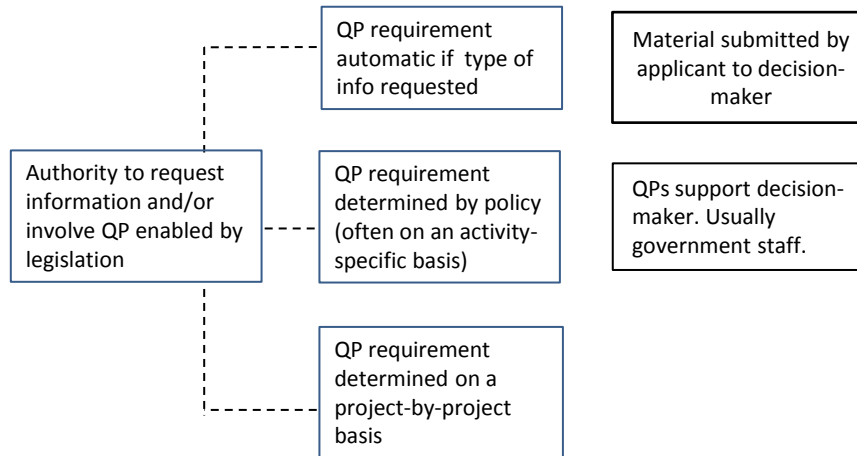
QP role in lieu of Government authorization

QP involvement as specified by legally binding Code of Practice or regulation. Registration may be required. The potential for government involvement varies.

QPs in Government authorization process

QP requirement directly specified by legislation or other binding instrument
