Major Capital Investments

- \$96 million to enhance and expand Prince George's **University Hospital of Northern B.C.**, including the Northern Medical School program.
- \$300 million to replace **Fort St John Hospital & Peace Villa**.
- \$14 million to renovate and upgrade **G.R. Baker Hospital** in Quesnel.
- \$10 million to renovate and upgrade **Prince Rupert Regional Hospital**.
- \$9 million to renovate and upgrade **Mills Memorial Hospital** in Terrace.
- \$55 million to redevelop **Lakes District Hospital and Health Centre** in Burns Lake.
- \$50 million to replace the **Queen Charlotte/Haida Gwaii Hospital**.
