

Provincial Health Services Authority

The Provincial Health Services Authority (PHSA) is one of six health authorities, with the other five serving geographic regions of British Columbia. PHSA's primary role is to ensure that B.C. residents have access to a coordinated network of high-quality specialized health care services.

Since 2002/03, expenditures have increased by \$1.2617 billion or 144 per cent.

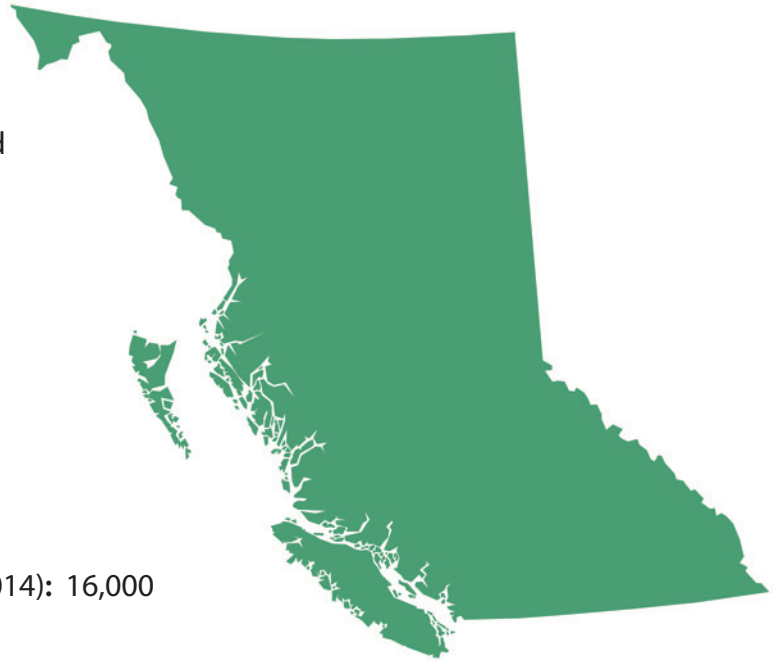

Major Capital Investments

- \$678 million for the redevelopment of **BC Children's and BC Women's hospitals**.
- \$106 million for the Northern Cancer Control Strategy, including a new **BC Cancer Centre for the North** in Prince George.
- \$19 million for a child, adolescent and women's mental health facility.
- \$10 million for renovations and acquisition of two positron emission tomography (PET/CT) scanners at the **Vancouver Cancer Centre**.
- \$15 million for radiopharmaceutical lab and cyclotron at the **Vancouver Cancer Centre**.
