On September 20-21, 2021, the Emergency Medical Assistants Licensing Board (the “Board”) held a hearing to determine the issues raised by the charges, namely whether the Respondent breached a term or condition of his licence by submitting several claims for hours worked when he allegedly did not work the hours claimed. Pursuant to Rule 17.4 of the Rules for Complaints, Investigations and Disciplinary Hearings (the “Rules”), the Director must post a summary of the order referred to in Rule 17.2 on the Board website.

The EMA did attend the hearing. Upon hearing evidence and the submissions of Discipline Counsel, the Board pursuant to s.7 of the *Emergency Health Services Act*, was satisfied on a balance of probabilities that the Respondent breached a term or condition of their licence.

As such, on Penalty July 20, 2022, the Board imposed the following conditions on the Respondent’s licence:

- a. The Respondent must write an essay, to the satisfaction of the Board, on the importance of ethical standards and professionalism in conducting activities as an EMA, wherein he reflects on his actions and how they are inconsistent with the trust and responsibility of the EMA position he holds. The Respondent must provide the essay to the Board by September 9, 2022.
- b. Upon completion of the essay, the Respondent must complete a consultation session regarding ethical standards and professionalism with a branch-appointed clinical consultant to the satisfaction of the Board before October 7, 2022.
- c. The Registrant’s EMA license will be suspended for four (4) months commencing July 21, 2022.
