

Joel Nervais (the “Respondent”)

The Respondent was alleged to not have properly assessed the patient’s injuries and making the patient stand up and walk to the stretcher after they sustained injuries from a fall.

On August 8, 2022, the Respondent admitted to the allegations and resolved the disciplinary matter by way of an Alternative Dispute Resolution agreement (the “Agreement”) with the Emergency Medical Assistants Licensing Board (the “Board”). Under the Agreement, the Respondent was required 1) to successfully complete an International Trauma Life Support Course (the “Course”), no later than six months after the Board approved the Agreement; 2) submit an essay to the Board, using the case as its topic, to review what he learned from the course, within 30 days of the completion of the Course, and 3) complete a clinical consultation with a resource person no later than 90 days after the Board approved the essay.

The Respondent has completed all requirements of the Agreement as of September 27, 2022, and all conditions have been removed from their licence.
