

Cassey Irvine 106871(the “Respondent”)

Date and place of hearing regarding penalty: By written submissions

On April 5-6, 2022, the Emergency Medical Assistants Licensing Board (the “Board”) convened a hearing to determine whether Cassey Irvine (the “Respondent”), a registrant who holds an Emergency Medical Assistant (“EMA”) licence at the Primary Care Paramedic (“PCP”) level, breached a term or condition of her licence.

On September 14, 2022, the Board issued its decision with respect to the Charge (the “Disciplinary Decision”). In the Disciplinary Decision, the Board determined, pursuant to section 7 of the *Emergency Health Services Act*, RSBC 1996, c 182 (the “Act”), it was satisfied the Respondent breached a term or condition of her licence.

On January 23, 2023, the Board issued its decision on penalty imposing the following conditions on the Respondent’s licence:

- (a) The Respondent must successfully complete a course in professionalism in paramedicine by June 30, 2023. The course must be pre-approved by the Board.
- (b) The Respondent must successfully complete a course on clinical decision-making by June 30, 2023. The course must be pre-approved by the Board.
- (c) Following completion of the courses identified in paragraphs (b) and (c), the Respondent must write an essay, to the satisfaction of the Board, addressing the topics of professionalism and clinical decision-making as they relate to the findings made by the Board in the Disciplinary Decision. The Respondent must provide the essay to the Board by August 31, 2023.
- (d) Upon completion of the courses and essay, the Respondent must successfully complete a clinical consultation session regarding the topics of professionalism and clinical decision-making with a branch-appointed clinical consultant by September 30, 2023.

The Respondent’s EMA licence expires as of June 10, 2027. If the Respondent has not complied with the orders set out above, the Board further orders that she not be permitted to renew her registration until the conditions have been complied with.

The conditions imposed by the Decision on Penalty were satisfied and on April 9, 2024 the complaint file was closed.
