Alternative Dispute Resolution Agreement signed date: September 17, 2024

On September 17, 2024, the Emergency Medical Assistants Licensing Board (the “Board”), pursuant to Rule 7.1 (c) of the Rules for Complaints, Investigations and Disciplinary Hearings, resolved the matter with the agreement of the Respondent by way of an alternative dispute resolution (the “Agreement”).

As part of the Agreement, the Respondent acknowledges and admits to acting incompetently and breaching a term and condition of their licence between January 2023 and February 2023 in or around the City of Vancouver by incompetently performing basic EMA and PCP license services.

Further, as part of the Agreement, the Respondent agreed to only perform at the licence level of Emergency Medical Assistant First Responder until the first of the following events occur:

- A. They complete a full Board recognized training program followed by the written and practical Board examinations for either licence levels Emergency Medical Responder or Primary Care Paramedic.
- B. Their EMA licence expires on March 4, 2026, requiring the Respondent to either renew at the Emergency Medical Assistant First Responder level or allow the license to remain expired. License renewal at the Emergency Medical Assistant First Responder level shall require regular FR licensing examinations in accordance with section 9.1 of the EMA Regulation.

Upon either of the above events occurring, this Agreement will be deemed by the Board to have been resolved. Failure to complete either of the terms listed in A or B shall result in a denial of the license renewal application.
