Alternative Dispute Resolution agreement signed date: October 23,2024

On October 23,2024, the Emergency Medical Assistants Licensing Board (the “Board”), pursuant to Rule 7.1 (c) of the Rules for Complaints, Investigations and Disciplinary Hearings, resolved the matter with the agreement of the Respondent by way of an alternative dispute resolution (the “Agreement”). As part of the Agreement, the Respondent acknowledged and admitted to breaching a term and condition of their Emergency Medical Assistants (“EMA”) licence between December 10, 2018, and December 9, 2020, by committing the act of sexual interference of a person under the age of 16, contrary to s. 151 of the Criminal Code, RSC 1985, c C-46.

The Respondent, as part of the Agreement, acknowledged that they relinquished their EMA licence as of September 11, 2023, and agreed to not reapply for an EMA licence for three (3) years from the date the Agreement was executed.
