Alternative Dispute Resolution agreement dated: August 21, 2025

On August 21, 2025, the Emergency Medical Assistants Licensing Board (the "Board"), pursuant to Rule 7.1 (c) of the Rules for Complaints, Investigations and Disciplinary Hearings, resolved the matter with the agreement of the Respondent by way of an alternative dispute resolution (the "Agreement").

As part of the Agreement, the Respondent admitted to acting incompetently and breaching terms and conditions of their EMA licence in Mission, BC and Abbotsford, BC while assisting patients by incompetently assessing and directing the needs of calls on May 1st and 3rd, 2023.

As part of the Agreement, the Respondent agreed to successfully complete the following Board examinations at their own expense: the Board's Advanced Care Paramedic (ACP) written examination; and ACP practical examination, medical and trauma. The Respondent also agreed that their EMA licence will have a direct supervision condition until the aforementioned examinations are deemed successfully completed. All of which must be completed within 120 days of the Respondent receiving a copy of the signed Agreement.

The Agreement provided that if the respondent fails to submit proof of their successful completion of examinations within 120 days the Respondents licence would be suspended for seven (7) days.

The Agreement also provided that the registrant's licence is set to expire on February 23, 2027. If the conditions listed above in paragraph 6 are not completed at the time of license expiry, the registrant's licence shall not be renewed until completion of the conditions of the Agreement.

On April 2, 2026, the Board granted an extension of time until July 31, 2026 to complete the Agreement requirements.
