### 1. Policy Rationale & Purpose:

International applicants are assessed by the EMA Licensing Branch or contract assessor and recommendations are submitted to the Board for approval. As part of the International assessment process, applicants must verify proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing the English language. English language proficiency must be established.

### 2. Policy Scope

This policy applies to international applicants that are:

- registered as an EMA outside of Canada and have not completed their training and education in English and have not worked in an area where English is the primary language; and
- registered as a Health Professional outside of Canada and have not completed their training and education in English and have not worked in an area where English is the primary language, provided their training, education, and experience incorporates out of hospital emergency medicine skills.

### 3. Policy Statement:

Verification of English language proficiency can be demonstrated by successfully meeting one of the following test requirements, proof of which must be provided to the Branch upon request.
