Date of Hearing: April 5-6, 2022

Location: via Videoconference

Cassey Irvine (the “Respondent”), a registrant who holds an emergency medical assistant (“EMA”) licence at the primary care paramedic (“PCP”) level, was charged with acting incompetently and breaching a term or condition of her licence on or about July 22, 2020, when attending a female patient who suffered a head injury, and on October 18, 2020, when attending a female for a postpartum hemorrhage (the “Charge”).

The Emergency Medical Assistants Licensing Board (the “Board”), pursuant to section 7 of the *Emergency Health Services Act*, RSBC 1996, c 182, directed that a hearing be held with respect to the Charge. The matter came on for hearing on April 5-6, 2022.

On September 14, 2022, the Board rendered its decision finding that the Respondent breached a term or condition of her licence. Specifically, the Board found that on July 22, 2020, the Respondent breached sections (a), (g) and (j) of the *Code of Ethics*, by failing to call a paramedic specialist and get advice regarding the transportation of the female patient with a head injury. Further, the Board found that by failing to respond to the urgency of the situation on October 18, 2020, the Respondent breached sections (a), (g) and (j) of the *Code of Ethics*.
