1. Introduction

A number of measures employed to prevent or mitigate the impacts of influenza in communities that do not involve the use of medications or vaccines are collectively known as "public health measures". In response to H1N1 influenza, B.C. and other provinces and territories have been working with the Public Health Agency of Canada to develop a number of guidelines about public health measures, supplemented by B.C. developed guidelines.
