Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) 2022 Quarter Four Statistical Report October 1 – December 31, 2022



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1. Data Limitations and Data Suppression

The data presented is collected in accordance with the <u>Federal Regulations for the</u> <u>Monitoring of Medical Assistance in Dying</u> that came into force on November 1, 2018. In British Columbia, the Ministry of Health was designated as the recipient of all federally reportable information for the province. Medical practitioners and nurse practitioners are required to report on all written requests for MAiD, and pharmacists must report on the dispensation of drugs for the purposes of MAiD.

To protect the personal health information and privacy of those who have requested or received MAiD, statistics involving small numbers (less than a dozen individuals) have been suppressed to remove the risk of potential identification of individuals through the combination of datasets.

The data in this report represents **640** individuals who were provided MAiD between **October 1, 2022, and December 31, 2022**.

As some individuals have multiple underlying medical conditions, the percentages do not total to 100%. The occurrence of each condition may also be slightly higher than indicated due to medical conditions that have been reported only as part of the Multiple Co-Morbidities option and not as an individual condition.
