

## Medical Assistance in Dying in British Columbia: Reporting at a Glance

### Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD):

### Your Reporting Responsibilities as a physician, nurse practitioner or pharmacist

If you receive a written request for medical assistance in dying, you are responsible for filing a report. A written request may take any form (e.g. the Patient Request Record form [HLTH 1632], written request on paper, text, or email). It does not have to be in the format required as a safeguard under the Criminal Code (i.e. duly signed, dated and witnessed). The request does not have to result in a MAiD death to be deemed reportable.

As of November 1, 2018, the BC Ministry of Health is the designated recipient of all federally and provincially required MAiD reporting from physicians, nurse practitioners, and pharmacists. **Reporting is accomplished by submitting the requisite provincial form(s) by fax to the BC Ministry of Health within the timeframes described below.** Physicians, nurse practitioners and pharmacists must use the current forms, which are available on the Ministry website at the link provided below.

**Notes:**

- \* Submit to the Ministry of Health and, if required by Health Authority, the physician or nurse practitioner is to fax the requisite form(s) to the applicable MAiD Care Coordination Service. Contact information is provided on each form.
- \*\* The 1642 form should only be sent to the Ministry of Health.
- \*\*\* For MAiD deaths where the underlying condition relates to an accident, violence or self-inflicted injury, the death will also need to be reported directly to the BC Coroners Service (as per the Coroners Act) by the prescriber at 1-855-207-0637.
- \*\*\*\* Please contact the College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC for a copy of the provincial Prescription and Medical Administration Record Form (Rx + MAR)
