

How to claim PharmaCare fees for pharmacy services

- Patients cannot be charged for the services
- Enter claims in PharmaNet on the same day as service

COVID-19 vaccines	\$12.10	Record in ImmsBC. Do not record in PharmaNet.
Clinical services <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A pharmacy can claim fees for any combination of clinical services up to \$78.00 per patient per day. However, a medication review service can't be claimed with a MACS or vaccination for the same patient if conducted on the same day – only the MACS claim and/or vaccination will be reimbursed • The Ministry pays a maximum of two clinical services fees per drug, per person, during a 6-month period (except for MACS) 		
Prescription renewals Renew prescriptions with no further refills for up to 2 years from date Rx written	\$10.00 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Patient must have valid prescription issued within the previous 24 months, and • No recent change to the prescription for usually a minimum of six months 	In SIG field, type "adapted" followed by the regular SIG <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enter intervention code: NL – renewal
Prescription adaptations Change dose, formulation or regimen	\$10.00	In SIG field, type "adapted" followed by the regular SIG <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enter intervention code: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ NJ: formulation change ◦ NK: directions for use modified ◦ NI: dosage change
Therapeutic substitutions Within therapeutic class	\$17.20	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In SIG field, type "adapted" followed by the regular SIG • Enter intervention code: NM – therapeutic substitution
Emergency fill and emergency contraceptives	No fee	Enter intervention code: NN – emergency supply
Minor Ailments and Contraception Service (MACS)	\$20.00	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enter intervention code: PS – professional care service • Visit MACS conditions, PINs and drugs for details
