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Minor Changes to Patient Education Monograph Data

The New Year ushered in some small changes to the clinical data provided to PharmaNet by First DataBank.

The only visible changes were in the Patient Education Monographs that PharmaNet provides. They now include phonetic pronunciations for the names of generic drugs, as well as a longer disclaimer. (Monographs produced by internal vendor software did not change.)
