

Did you come to B.C. through the Canada-Ukraine authorization for emergency travel (CUAET)?

Welcome! BC PharmaCare is a government program. We help people in B.C. pay for many prescriptions, pharmacy services, and some medical devices and supplies.

NOT ENROLLED IN MSP YET?

Get emergency help with prescription costs

If you are prescribed medication by a B.C. doctor or nurse, ask them to fill out the Emergency BC PharmaCare Coverage for Ukrainian Arrivals form. Give the form to the pharmacy with your prescription(s) and PharmaCare will pay all eligible costs.



ENROLLED IN MSP?

You have 1 year of 100% PharmaCare coverage

Once you are enrolled in MSP, PharmaCare pays 100% of your eligible prescription, pharmacy, medical devices and supply costs for 1 year (under Plan C). A pharmacy cannot charge you for eligible items or services.



WHEN YOUR YEAR OF 100% COVERAGE ENDS

Apply for Fair PharmaCare at www.gov.bc.ca/ahdc

Apply for the Fair PharmaCare plan before your Plan C coverage ends, so you can continue receiving help. Fair PharmaCare is based on income. The lower your income, the more help you get. You will need to submit a CRA Notice of Assessment for the year previous to the current year, if available, or complete the Fair PharmaCare Proof of Income Affidavit as part of your application.



HOW DOES IT WORK?

Your pharmacy bill shows the prescription cost and how much PharmaCare covers. You do not need to submit receipts.

WHAT DOES PHARMACARE HELP PAY FOR?

- Most drugs prescribed by a B.C. physician, dentist, midwife, nurse practitioner, optometrist or podiatrist
- Diabetes supplies
- Ostomy supplies
- Prostheses
- Children's orthoses
- And more!

WHAT IS MSP?

MSP is the BC Medical Servicces Plan. All B.C. residents must enrol as soon as they arrive in B.C. See gov.bc.ca/ahdc
