If the application is submitted within 14 days prior to the hearing date, it is advised you contact the court registry directly to confirm the status of your application.

Note to Enforcement Officers

Enforcement officers must contact the court registry for a date to hear the adjournment application **prior** to submitting this form. A completed notification of adjournment application form (PTR 819) must be mailed by the enforcement officer to the disputant if they cannot be reached and informed of the adjournment application by telephone or in person, at least 14 days prior to the hearing date.
