# Overview

- ▶ Budget 2022 announced stable, ongoing annual funding for SAS programs in the province. This program will replace the Emergency Sexual Assault Services (ESAS) Grant program.
- ▶ Ministry staff are working to establish a program service description and a procurement process for the new, ongoing programs to be funded beginning April 2023 following the end of the ESAS grant program funding.
- ▶ These engagement sessions include General and Indigenous Stream Grant Recipients and victim service/violence against women service providers.

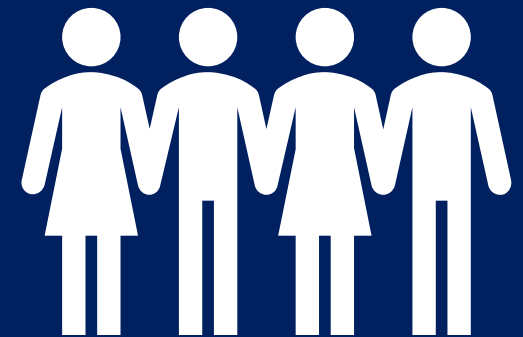
