WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT 19 – 25 May 2014

DANGEROUS GOODS

On 19 May 14, Vernon Fire Rescue responded to a call from the RCMP who were dealing with an individual reportedly contaminated by meth lab chemicals in the Enderby area. The incident escalated to involve up to 10 contaminated people at the Vernon Hospital. On May 20, the incident was upgraded to Code 2 (urgent status) by the Ministry of Environment Response Officer (MOE RO). TASK 150747

On 22 May 14, Aspen Planers Sawmill experienced a gas leak that resulted in the evacuation of 24 people from the Clapperton Road area of Merritt. Emergency Social Services was called in and the residents were provided with refreshments at a local church. Two hours later, after the gas company gave the all clear, the residents were allowed to return home.

BODY RECOVERY

On 22 May 14, North Cowichan SAR responded to assist the Coroner with a body recovery in the Lake Cowichan area.

EVIDENCE SEARCH

On 19 May 14, Central Cariboo SAR responded to a request by the RCMP to perform an evidence search near the 11th Ave area of Williams Lake.

On 20 May 14, North Peace SAR responded to an RCMP request to locate evidence in the Fort St John area

On 23 May, Robson Valley SAR responded to look for possible human remains in the Westridge area.

MISCELLANEOUS

On 19 May 14, there was a reception center set up in Colwood due to reports of an unexploded pipe bomb on the 1st floor of a four story apartment building. People were evacuated and let in after the item had been detonated.

On 22 May 14, there was a reception centre set up in Merritt due to a gas leak in a residential area. 24 people were evacuated for two hours while the situation was stabilized.

FLOOD

On 20 May 14, Adams Lake Indian Band IR#6 was issued a task to track Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC) costs related to freshet flood activities.

On 23 May 14, a task was issued to the City of Kamloops to support flood response activities.

On 24 May 14 a task was issued to the Thompson-Nicola Regional District to support flood response activities in the area.
