## **WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT 13 APR – 19 APR 2015**

### **BODY RECOVERY**

On 18 Apr 15, Kamloops SAR members were requested to assist with a possible body recovery in the Tranquille, Criss Creek Road area near Kamloops. SAR was stood down prior to mustering, when RCMP members were able to access the subject without SAR assistance.

### **DANGEROUS GOODS**

On 16 Apr 15, a boat sunk in Blind Channel near the District of Squamish, the MOE RO (Ministry of Environment Response Officer) raised incident to Code 2 (urgent status) because of imminent media interest and the potential risk to the environment.

On 16 Apr 15, a fire was reported to be burning the creosote pilings of the Squamish Terminal Dock. The MOE RO (Ministry of Environment Response Officer) raised incident to Code 2 (urgent status) due to the environmental and health risks posed by toxic smoke from burning creosote. Residents in the vicinity were asked to shelter in place. Multiple agencies including EMBC, Environment Canada, Ministry of Environment, District of Squamish, and Ministry of Health and the Health Authority worked to determine and remediate the level of impact to both the environment and public health.

### **MISCELLANEOUS**

On 15 Apr 15, Kamloops ESS responded to assist with Summit Elementary School evacuation due to a police incident.

On 15 Apr 15, the City of Kelowna activated their EOC in support of a tactical evacuation of Orchard Park Mall because of a bomb threat.

On 16 Apr 15, the District of Squamish activated their EOC to coordinate community response because of a fire at the Squamish Terminal Dock.
