WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT 23 - 29 Oct 2017

DANGEROUS GOODS

On 24 Oct 2017, an ammonia leak occurred at a chicken processing plant in Port Coquitlam. The Ministry of Environment Response Officer raised the incident to Code 2 (urgent status) for notification purposes due to heightened media sensitivity.

FLOODING

On 23 Oct 2017, a task number was issued to the Village of Queen Charlotte for flooding from heavy rainfall that impacted Road 33 at the east end of the Village.

On 24 Oct 2017, the Kitimat/Stikine Regional District (KSRD) opened their EOC in response to flood related issues in the area.

On 24 Oct 2017, an incident was opened for flooding at Lakelse Lake that affected up to ten residents.

On 25 Oct 2017, a tactical evacuation of 30+ homes in the New Remo area was conducted when heavy rains caused a slough to rise quickly resulting in flooding in the Kitimat Stikine Regional District.

On 25 Oct 2017, a task number was issued to the NWE PREOC for response in support of several communities that were impacted by fall flood related incidents in the region.

On 25 Oct 2017, an incident was opened for the KSRD due to flooding in the Williams Creek FSR area.

On 25 Oct 2017, an incident was opened for the Central Coast Regional District (CKRD) for flooding from the Bella Coola River.

On 26 Oct 2017, an incident was opened following a landslide estimated to be about 5m high by 20m wide that ran for 150m on McConnell Crescent in Terrace. No residences were directly impacted. A geotech assessment was requested due to the potential risk posed by heavy rainfall in the future.

MISCELLANEOUS

On 27 Oct 2017, a task number was issued to the Kamloops ESS team to open a warming centre and provide assistance to 8 residents from the Tk-Emlups Te Secw- Epemc Indian Band, that were displaced from their trailer park, during a police incident.

On 28 Oct 2017, 3 Prince Rupert SAR members responded to rescue four treed kittens on 1st Avenue.

POWER OUTAGE

On 25 Oct 2017, a task number was issued for ESS to establish a reception centre for affected residents, following a power outage in the Queensborough area of New Westminster.
