WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT July 10 - 16, 2017

On 14 July 2017, a serious accident involving three semi-trucks caused a significant spill of diesel on Highway 1 in Langley. Due to the significance of the spill and the road closure the Ministry of Environment Response Officer (MOE RO) raised the incident to Code 2.

On 15 July 2017, a float plane attempted to land in Desolation Sound when it encountered choppy seas and tried to abort the landing. The pilot lost control, hit a rock which punctured a pontoon and potentially spilled aviation fuel in the water. The Ministry of Environment Response Officer (MOE RO) raised the incident to Code 2. It was determined the pontoon damaged was air filled and nothing leaked out to the water so incident was down-graded.

On 16 July 2017, a 65 ft wooden tug ran aground in the North Arm of the Fraser River near Richmond. Due to the potential risk of 1,000 litres of fuel spilling, the Ministry of Environment Response Officer (MOE RO) raised the incident to Code 2. It was determined that no diesel spilled and incident was down-graded.

EVIDENCE SEARCH

On 15 July 2017, at the request of the RCMP, Kaslo SAR performed an evidence search in the Coffee Creek Kootenay Lake area of Kaslo.

INTERFACE FIRE

On 10 July 2017, a 2017 fire season incident was generated for the Central Kootenay Regional District to activate their EOC to level one for planning and preparedness in anticipation of forecasted thunderstorms.

On 10 July 2017, an incident was opened for the Skeetchestn First Nation near Savona for activation of their EOC in response to a wildland interface fire K20637 burning in the Ashcroft area.

On 10 July 2017, an incident was opened by the town of Princeton to activate their EOC in response to a wildland interface fire K60643 burning in the Princeton area that resulted in an evacuation alert being issued.

On 10 July 2017, East Kootenay Regional District (EKRD) opened an incident for 2017 Fire season and activated their EOC to level one for planning and preparedness in anticipation of forecasted thunderstorms.

On 11 July 2017, an incident was opened for the Kamloops Indian Band in response to an interface wildland burning in the area. The incident was for pre-planning due to the potential consequences resulting from wildfires burning in the Kamloops area.

On 11 July 2017, an incident was opened for the Whispering Pines First Nations in response to a wildland interface fire K20637 burning in the Kamloops area. The community requested assistance with obtaining ventilation gear to help them deal with large amounts of smoke from nearby wildfires.

On 11 July 2017, an incident was generated for Kelowna Emergency Social Services to purchase cots for group lodging in support of evacuees from the wildland interface fires at the KLO Middle School.

On 12 July 2017, a task was issued to the SWE PREOC for the 2017 wildfire season. The threat of impacts due to interface wildfires was exacerbated by dry, hot windy weather combined with the potential for severe thunderstorms that affected the regions.

On 12 July 2017, an incident was opened for the Xeni Gwet'in First Nations Government in response to a wildland interface fire burning in the Alexis Creek area. The First Nations community was not in the evacuation area. They assisted with evacuees from nearby wildfires.

On 12 July 2017, an incident was opened for the Lhtako Dene Nation in response to wildland interface fires burning in the Quesnel area. The community was not in the evacuation area. They assisted with evacuees from affected by nearby wildfires.

On 12 July 2017, an incident was opened for the Ulkatcho First Nations in response to wildland interface fires burning in the Anahim Lake area. The community was not in the evacuation area. They assisted with evacuees from nearby wildfires.

On 12 July 2017, an incident was opened for the Tsi del del First Nations (Alexis Creek FN) in response to wildland interface fires burning in the Alexis Creek area. The band was not in the evacuation area but was assisting with evacuees from nearby wildfires.

On 12 July 2017, an incident was opened for the Esketemc First Nations Band in response to wildland interface fires burning in the Alkali Lake area, south of Williams Lake. The band was not in an evacuation area but assisted with evacuees from nearby wildfires.

On 12 July 2017, an incident was opened up by Emergency Social Services in Vernon to set up a Reception Center to process evacuees coming from other communities affected by wildland interface fires in the province.

On 13 July 2017, an incident was opened the Cariboo Regional District in response to an wildland interface fire burning near Mooree Mountain in the Cariboo Regional District.

On 13 July 2017, an incident was opened for the Toosey First Nation (TI'Esqox) in response to a wildland interface fire burning in the Williams Lake area of Cariboo Regional District.

On 14 July 2017, an incident was generated in response to an wildland interface fire burning near Kleena Kleene K50744 in the Cariboo Regional District which resulted in evacuations.

On 14 July 2017, an incident was opened by the City of Vernon to activate a group lodging facility in response to wildland interface fires which resulted in many displaced people coming from other communities in the province.

On 15 July 2017, an incident was opened for the District of Clearwater to activate an EOC in response to a wildland interface fire burning near Clearwater, which resulted in an evacuation alert being issued.

On 15 July 2017, an incident was opened for the Simpcw First Nation in response to a wildland interface fire K20666 burning near Barriere.

On 15 July 2017, an incident was opened for Kelowna to activate their EOC in response to a wildland interface fire K51118 burning near Lake Country which resulted in evacuation orders and alerts being issued.

On 15 July 2017, an incident was created for the Lhoosk'uz Dene Government /Kluskus First Nation in response to a wildland interface fire C10830 burning near Nazko.

On 15 July 2017, an incident was opened for Williams Lake in response to a wildland interface fire burning C20713 near Williams Lake which resulted in evacuation orders being issued.

On 15 July 2017 an incident was opened for the Stswecem'c Xgat'tem First Nation in response to a wildland interface fire C50647 burning in the Canoe Creek area near Alexis Creek.

On 15 July 2017, an incident was opened for the Nazko First Nation in response to a wildland interface fire burning C10970 near Nazko which resulted in some evacuations by Band Council Resolution in the Mamot Lake area.

On 15 July 2017, an incident was opened for Salmon Arm to open a reception centre and EOC in response to an wildland interface fire burning in other areas of the province. Evacuees who arrived in the area were provided assistance.

On 15 July 2017, an incident was opened for the Central Coast Regional District (CCRD) in the Bella Coola area in response to wildland interface fires for the potential opening of a reception centre for displaced residents from Williams Lake Fire area.

On 15 July 2017, an incident was opened by the City of Chilliwack (CCRD) in response to wildland interface fires burning in multiple areas of the province. An ESS Reception Centre was opened to process evacuees in the area.

On 15 July 2017, an incident was opened for the City of Armstrong in response to the Wildland Interface Fires to activate their EOC to provide Emergency Social Service support for evacuees coming into the area.

On 15 July 2017, an incident was opened for the City of Merritt to activate a reception centre and group lodging in response to evacuees coming to Merritt from wildland interface fire areas in the province.

On 15 July 2017, an incident was opened for Cache Creek to activate their EOC in response to the wildland interface fires burning in the Cache Creek area.

On 16 July 2017, an incident was created for Okanagan Similkameen Regional District (OSRD) for the opening of a reception centre in Penticton in response to evacuee's coming from other communities affected by wildland interface fires.

On 16 July 2017, an incident was opened for City of Surrey to open an EOC to process evacuee's coming from other communities due to wildland interface fire evacuees.

On 16 July 2017, an incident was opened for the City of Vernon to activate a second site for group lodging for evacuee's coming from other communities due to wildland interface fires,

MISCELLANEOUS

On 11 July 2017, RCMP located a suspected drug lab in downtown Cranbrook. An incident was opened to activate a Reception Centre to accommodate 50-60 people. No drug lab was located and the residents returned back home.
