WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT June 08-14 2020

BODY RECOVERY

On 08 June, Nelson SAR conducted a body recover north of Nelson.

On 13 June, Nechako Valley SAR conducted a body recovery in Fraser Lake.

DANGEROUS GOODS CODE 2

On 13 June, Trans Mountain Pipeline suffered a release of crude petroleum oil at their Sumas Pump Station in Abbotsford, that resulted in a vapour cloud of H2S/LEL to be dispersed to company property. Local first responders maintained safe distance at the site perimeter and near-by residents were advised to shelter in place. The MOE RO raised the incident to a Code 2 (urgent status) due to potential public safety concerns and media attention, until the company was able to isolate and repair the leak and all air monitoring levels returned a zero reading.

On 13 June, a wooden tugboat sank, in Gibsons Harbour with an unknown amount of diesel and lube oil on board. Containment booms were placed around the vessel and NASP overflights detected a sheen estimated to be approximately 5 litres in volume within the containment area. The MOE RO raised the incident to Code 2 (urgent status) due to the risk of potential environmental impacts during salvage operations.

MISCELLANEOUS

On 09 June, a TASK number was issued to Boston Bar / North Bend Fire Department to support their response to a grass fire along Highway 1 near the boundary of their fire suppression area.

FLOODING

On 09 June, an incident was opened to support the overland flooding associated to Windermere Creek.

On 10 June, an incident was opened to support the Columbia Shuswap Regional District with flooding associated to Newsome Creek.

On 14 June, an incident was opened to support the City of Dawson Creek with flood response.

On June 14, Peace River Regional District ESS responded to support 2 people evacuated from their property in Farmington, due to flooding.
