

FUEL OR ENERGY - FU

Fuel or Energy denotes the fuel or energy used in conjunction with the Igniting Object.

Notes: a) If lightning is involved, code under 7000.

b) In the case of an exposure fire, code under 8000.

Example: If a fire results from gasoline being used to accelerate a coal fired stove, the fuel or energy used in conjunction with the stove (igniting object) is the coal and should be classified under 1000.

- 1000 Solid fuel (e.g. coal, wood, pellets, paper or waste used for lighting or incidental burning)
- 2000 Fuel oil (includes diesel and kerosene)
- 3000 Gasoline

Fuel Gases (4100 - 4400)

- 4100 Fuel gas - natural gas
- 4200 Fuel gas - propane
- 4300 Fuel gas - other (describe)
- 4400 Fuel gas - unknown

- 5000 Smoker's material (includes cigarette, cigar, pipe, match or lighter)
- 5100 Match or lighter NOT used in conjunction with smoking
- 6000 Electricity
- 7000 Lightning
- 8000 Exposure fire

- 0009 Fuel or energy - unclassified (describe)
