The findings should be interpreted with caution as they do not take a coroner's investigative findings into consideration. The OFC and the BCCS are working to reconcile their data sets.

### **Areas of Interest for this Quarter**



23 fires in mobile homes/trailer parks resulting in one death and over \$2.5 million in loss.



75 fires were because of an electrical short circuit causing 1 death and over \$4 million in loss.



26 fires were started with a portable barbeque resulting in 2 injuries.



**184 fires** extended beyond the property of origin.

#### **Fire Cause Contributors**

This section refers to the human action or inaction that contributed to the fire cause or which caused the fire for all reported fires.


- **315** fires were caused by the unawareness of a hazard
  - **77** fires were caused by people who were distracted or preoccupied
  - 69 fires were caused by suspected impairment use of alcohol, drugs, or medication

#### **Actions Taken to Combat the Fire**


- **73%** of fires were extinguished by a fire department
- of fires were extinguished by others (e.g., passer-by, occupant, witness, etc.)
  - **9%** of fires did not require extinguishing and burned out
  - **4%** of fires where actions varied, e.g., fire extinguished by automatic system, shut off gas, oil, electricity, or it was a minor fire (e.g., exposure damage, blistering) with no action taken, unknown

#### **Deaths**


There were 17 reported deaths in BC during 2024 Q3 and 17 deaths reported in 2023 Q3.



## **Sources of Ignition for Structure Fires**





## **Building Height: Fire Breakdowns**
