Extinguish your fire by stirring water into the ashes until it is cool to the touch—hot coals can reignite the fire.


Ensure that your fire is completely extinguished before leaving the area.







A "category 2 open fire" means an open fire, other than a category 1 campfire, that burns:

- material in one pile not exceeding 2 metres in height and 3 metres in width,
- material concurrently in two piles each not exceeding 2 metres in height and 3 metres in width,
- stubble or grass over an area that does not exceed 0.2 hectares.



- Always check for open fire prohibitions or restrictions before engaging in any activity that could potentially cause a wildfire.
- Ensure you comply with the Environmental Management Act and Open Burning Smoke Control Regulation.
- Do not burn when venting conditions are poor or fair.
- Do not leave the fire unattended for any amount of time.
 - The person who lights or maintains the fire must ensure that the fire is fully extinguished and the ashes are cold to the touch before leaving the area for any length of time.
 - Anyone found in violation of an open fire prohibition may be fined up to \$1,150. If your fire escapes and results in a wildfire, you may be fined up to \$1 million, be sentenced up to 1 year in jail as well and be responsible for all fire fighting and associated costs.
