

ORDER TO PROHIBIT CAMPING ON CROWN LAND WITHIN THE JOHN HART LAKE COMMUNITY WATERSHED

The District Manager of the Campbell River Forest District, Ministry of Forests, in accordance with section 105 of the *Forest Practices Code of British Columbia Act*, prohibits overnight camping on Crown Land within a "No Camping Zone" of John Hart Lake Community Watershed.

With the agreement of the Municipal Water Purveyor (District of Campbell River) this camping prohibition is ordered to protect their domestic water supply from potential contamination from human fecal coliform and other pollutants.

Several access roads within the Community Watershed are also closed to vehicular traffic.

The District Manager is granted the authority under section 105 of the *Forest Practices Code of British Columbia Act* to restrict, prohibit, or attach a condition to a public recreation use anywhere on Crown Land outside Provincial parks:

- 105 (1) *If the District Manager determines that it is necessary to protect a recreation resource or manage public recreation use on Crown Land, he or she may, by written order, restrict, prohibit or attach a condition to:*
- (b) *a recreational use anywhere on Crown Land, except a use that is specifically permitted by or under another enactment.*

This order is effective October 15, 2001 and remains in effect indefinitely.

A legal map of the "No Camping Zone" and the locations of road closures, are shown on the 1:40,000 scale map dated October 11, 2001 attached as Exhibit A.
