



GUIDING SANCTIONS IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Note: The requirement for an assistant guide licence is removed. However, a transition provision ensures that any prohibitions or limitations that a person faced in relation to an assistant guide licence continue to apply to that person. In other words, if a person has been prohibited from holding an assistant guide licence, the restriction and remaining period of ineligibility will continue to apply, but now in relation to their eligibility to apply for employment as an assistant hunting guide. The person may still take the approved exam at any time, but they remain ineligible to be hired as an assistant hunting guide until the prohibition (sanction) expires.
