REGIONAL BAG LIMITS

Deer: The bag limit for mule (black-tailed) deer is 3, of which only two may be antlerless from Special Areas and only two may be bucks.

The bag limit for antlerless mule (black-tailed) deer taken during the youth only season or the youth bow only season in MUs 1-1, 1-2, 1-4, 1-5, and 1-6 is one.

Grouse: The daily bag limit for blue (sooty) and ruffed grouse is 5 each. See page 12 for additional information on bag limits.

- ★ Year-round Motor Vehicle Closed Areas (See page 10):
- ★ The Parksville-Qualicum Wildlife Management Area in MU 1-5 (see Map A16)

- ★ Block 1392 of MU 1-5 on Green Mountain (in order to protect the habitat for Vancouver Island Marmots)
- ATV and Snowmobile Closed Area (See page 10): Nanaimo River Camp (Zone B of MU 1-5) in the watershed of the Nanaimo River from Sept 1 - Dec 31 (see Map A12).

IT'S UNLAWFUL

» To use a wireless camera for the purpose of hunting in Region 1.

NOTICE TO HUNTERS

- » Hunting regulations for Mule (black-tailed) deer and Fallow deer are very different. Please ensure that you are informed and able to distinguish between the two species when hunting.
- » Antlerless deer hunters please review the regulations carefully. There is no open season for antlerless deer in areas where rifles are permitted in Region 1 except by way of Limited Entry Hunting in a portion of MU

- 1-15 and for youth hunters in MUs 1-1, 1-2, 1-4, 1-5, and 1-6. Please refer to special seasons in special shotgun or bow only portions of MUs 1-2, 1-4, 1-5, 1-6, and 1-15: see Maps A10, A13, A14, A19, A20, and A32.
- » Hunters should be aware of No Hunting and No Shooting Areas described on page 10. Hunters are also responsible for identifying and complying with community/municipal No Shooting bylaws. Municipal bylaws that affect the discharge of firearms and/or bows are not included in this synopsis. For more information, contact individual municipalities.
- » No hunting of black bears within 800 m of the intersection of Beaver Cove Road and Telegraph Cove Road in MU 1-11
- » Hunters are reminded that the Nanaimo River estuary is within city limits. A municipal bylaw restricts hunting to only a portion of the estuary and only during migratory bird seasons. Maps of the area open to hunting are available for viewing at the Ministry Regional Office in Nanaimo, or from the City of Nanaimo.
- » The discharge of rifles is prohibited in MU 1-1 except on Valdes Island, Sidney Island and James Island (and except by permit elsewhere). Note: No Shooting or Hunting areas in MU 1-1, Maps A1, A2, A4, and A7.
- » Nanoose Bay No Shooting Area (MU 1-5) From the mean high water mark at the southeast corner of the Qualicum National Wildlife Area east to the mean high water mark on the Department of Defence property line and the shore area between these points (400 m out onto the water from the mean high water mark).
- » Qualicum National Wildlife Areas (MU 1-6) -Hunting, trapping, fishing, or the possession of any firearm (Canada Wildlife Act) is prohibited in this area. For further details contact the Canadian Wildlife Service office in Delta (604-350-1950) Pacific Wildlife Research Centre.
- » The discharge of firearms is prohibited within

- 25 m on either side of the midline of Westcan Terminals Road east of Indian Reserve #9 and 25 m seaward from and including the paved area of Westcan Terminals Port site (situated in MU 1-4). See Map A8.
- » Cowichan River No Shooting Area (MU 1-4). The discharge of firearms is Prohibited within 100 m of the high water mark of the Cowichan River from a point starting on the River immediately north of the Holt Creek Trailhead upstream along the Cowichan River to the Municipality of Lake Cowichan.

GULF ISLANDS SPECIAL HUNTING AREA

- » Gulf Islands special hunting area comprised of Denman and Hornby Islands (MU 1-6) and all islands within MU 1-1 (except Vancouver Island).
- » The majority of these islands are comprised of private land and National Park. Prior to hunting on private land, hunters must obtain permission from the owner of the property they intend to hunt. There is no hunting within Gulf Islands National Park.
- » Hunters must have \$100,000 or more in public liability and property damage insurance while hunting unless guided by a guide outfitter or assistant quide.
- » All persons 18 years of age or older hunting on the Gulf Islands Special Hunting Area are required to purchase a Gulf Islands Special Area Licence; available at Service BC, FrontCounter BC, participating vendors or online at www.gov. bc.ca/hunting.
- » Persons under the age of 18 must be accompanied by someone over the age of 18 who holds a Gulf Island Special Area Licence.
- » No open season for upland game birds (grouse, pheasant, quail) on Denman Island (situated in MU 1-6).

Ungulate Health

Concerns with ungulate health are rising with the recent detection of Adenovirus Hemorrhagic Disease (AHD) in B.C. and detection of Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) closer to BC. AHD was first identified in the fall of 2020 on several Gulf Islands (Galiano, Mayne, Pender, and Salt Spring) and southern Vancouver Island as far north as Merville. AHD is a highly contagious and often fatal disease, particularly in black-tailed deer. It has caused significant losses of deer in the U.S.

The disease course is usually rapid as the virus damages small blood vessels in the lungs and intestines. Symptoms of AHD include difficulty breathing, foaming, or drooling from the mouth, diarrhea, and seizures. If an infected animal survives the acute phase, chronic signs may include ulcers and abscesses in the mouth and throat that can lead to weight loss and death. Fawns/juveniles are more susceptible to AHD and experience much higher death rates than adults. Affected animals are often found dead and in good body condition with no signs of trauma or other cause of death.

AHD can be spread through direct contact between deer or contact with fluids (saliva, feces, urine). Transmission may also occur through airborne routes, contaminated feed and water, and contaminated equipment. There is no evidence that AHD can be transmitted to humans and research supports that it is not transmitted to livestock or pets. Although there is no known risk to human health from AHD, hunters are advised not to consume meat from animals found dead, obviously ill or acting abnormally prior to death. To help prevent the spread of AHD, dispose of carcasses by deep burial, do not move infected, dead or live deer to new areas, and prevent aggregations of deer at artificial feeding or water sources.


CWD has not yet been detected in B.C. but the risk continues to increase as cases move closer to the border and high-risk material is brought into the B.C. Natural movement of infected animals puts certain parts of B.C. at greatest risk, but the disease could be introduced anywhere, including Vancouver Island, with the transport of infected carcasses and use of CWD contaminated material (i.e., urine-based scents). Help protect B.C. ungulates by understanding these risks, helping to increase awareness, and submitting your deer, elk, moose or caribou for testing. 


Map A1 Saanich Peninsula/Gulf Islands - Firearms/hunting restrictions and special antlerless season Sidney and James Islands.



Map A2 Ganges - No Shooting Area (MU 1-1).




Map A3 Cherry Point No Shooting Area (MU 1-4).




Map A4 Saturna Island - No Shooting or Hunting Area (MU 1-1).




Map A5 Nitinat River - No Shooting or Hunting Area (MU 1-4).




Map A6 Cowichan Lake - No Shooting or Hunting Area (MU 1-4).




Map A11 Englishman River - No Shooting Area (MU 1-5).




Map A16 Parksville-Qualicum Wildlife Management Area (WMA) (MU 1-5) Motor Vehicle Closed




Map A17 Willow Creek Motor Vehicle Closed Area (MU 1-6).




Map A18 Woodhus Slough No Hunting Area (MU 1-6).





Map A20 Qualicum/Parksville - Bow or Firearms Using Shot Only Area (MUs 1-5, 1-6) and special antlerless mule deer season.









Map A22 Comox Harbour No Shooting Area


Map A28 Kakweiken River Black Bear Closed Area (MU 1-15).






Map A26 Iron River/Oyster River Special 2 Point or better (and Youth Only antierless) Mule Deer Hunting Area (MU 1-6).






