PERMANENT REPAIR UPDATE

Permanent repairs are underway on Highway 1 to return the highway to full capacity. Construction is complete on the Tank Hill project, and the new bridge is now open to three lanes of vehicle traffic. Contractors have been selected for the replacement of Gladwin Culvert and Sackum Overhead Bridge, with work anticipated to start in the coming months.

Progress Overview



Work complete at Tank Hill

Location: Approximately 14 km east of Lytton

The new overpass separating highway and train traffic at Tank Hill is open to three lanes of vehicle traffic. Drivers will experience minor traffic delays to allow the final site cleanup to be done safely and efficiently.

A parking lot under the east end of the bridge has been constructed to provide community members with a safe place to leave their vehicle while fishing or hiking in the area in 2026.
